The Tribunal can only make a decision based on the information you provide. It is up to you to provide the information you consider important to your written response or reply. For example, you should attach any information, such as an affidavit or other documents, that supports what you say.

Delivery of your documents to all participants **and** the Tribunal must occur by the close of business day, 4:30 p.m., on the due date listed above. Submissions received after the due date may be rejected unless the Tribunal allows a request to file late submissions. Go to www.bchrt.bc.ca and click on Law Library and then Rules of Practice and Procedure, Rule 28(3) for more information about getting an extension of time to file
